# What happens if our Priest Celebrant is unable to preside at a Mass? by Deacon Paul, Pastoral Leader

From time to time, an emergency may occur such that our Priest celebrant does not appear for the weekend or Holy Day Mass. This, unfortunately, happened on Thursday morning, August 15<sup>th</sup>, at the 8:00 am Mass, as, due to a miscommunication, Father Bill was unable to attend the 8:00 am Mass. (He subsequently presided over the 6:00 pm Mass that day, so Thank You Father Bill!).

In such a situation, either due to illness, or travel issues (Father Bill lives in Pulaski) or miscommunication, when the priest is not present, the Deacon is authorized to conduct a EUCHARISTIC WORSHIP OUTSIDE THE MASS. This would include Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharistic mystery outside of Mass. Note that it is no longer referred to as a "communion service". The Deacon is specifically trained to conduct this type of liturgy in the absence of a Priest. In such a liturgy, the norms are followed such that there is always a Liturgy of the Word as well as Holy Communion immediately following, assuming there are enough consecrated hosts in the tabernacle. A homily at such a liturgy should NOT be given. In the event of a Holy Day or Weekend liturgy, this liturgy presided over by the Deacon will qualify for the Sunday or Holy Day obligation of the congregation. Any Mass intention scheduled for the missed Mass would be postponed until such time as it can be heard at another Mass.

If a Deacon is not present, such as what happened on August 15<sup>th</sup>, then another trained and qualified Parishioner, appointed by the Pastor or Pastoral leader, may lead the liturgy. However, in our Parish we do not have anyone so appointed or qualified under the new norms put out by the Bishop's conference. We may have someone in the future that will be able to so celebrate, but currently we do not have such a Parishioner.

Therefore, the policy at St. Mary of the Angels is that if both the Priest and the Deacon are unavailable, the Parishioners will be given instruction by the Lector or Usher to attend another nearby Parish to fulfill the Mass obligation. In our situation, there are at least fourteen other Catholic Parishes within a five mile radius of St. Mary's such that the obligation can be readily fulfilled in such an emergency. Thus, on August 15<sup>th</sup>, at the 8:00 am Mass, the proper policy was followed such that the attendees were told of the other area morning Masses. Parishioners also could have fulfilled their obligation by attending the 6:00 pm Mass at St. Mary's.

I hope this somewhat explains our policy in the absence of a Priest. If you should have any questions or want further clarification, please do not hesitate to contact me.

## A Little Background on Fr. Bill by Fr. Bill Stout

Dear fellow Parishioners of St. Mary of the Angels:

It is with great happiness and pleasure that I have been given the honor of being appointed as the Priest Moderator and Sacramental Minister of our parish. I thank God... and YOU... for receiving me into this blessed ministry.

Given my recent "ARRIVAL on the SCENE" at St. Mary's, it seems only fair and appropriate that in this issue of our Angelus... I offer you a little background info so that I might not remain too much of a <u>'mystery'</u> person whom you keep encountering here at St. Mary of the Angels Parish. With that said, here is a bit about me.

Your "Fr. Bill Stout, OFM" grew up on the Far Northeastern side of the City of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Our section of the City, and my parent's home, were literally on the "edge" of the City Line. This means that I could go a half a mile <u>NORTH</u> of my home and find <u>Corn Fields and Dairy Farms</u> and <u>wide open spaces and woodsy playground spaces</u> that kids love as their playgrounds. On the other hand, I could also then ride my bike **SOUTH** and find myself in more tightly packed "CITY" environs... similar to Green Bay. I am happy I did not grow up in the too tightly packed "Inner City" environs... and so I find my current location in Green Bay "IDEAL."

ney like Deacon Paul, and my Mother was a wonderful "Home-Maker." My Father's "STOUT" family name traces itself back to English immigrants and American Colonists... arriving in America in the late 1600's. My Mother's Family are Irish immigrants, with my Grandparents being born "Irishmen" and coming from Ireland and into the United States in the early 1920's. I come from the "Big" CATHOLIC Families era --- and my immediate family held 7 children: one son (Me), and my six sisters. When the only son in an Irish Catholic family becomes a priest, well --- as my sisters will tell you—he's like an 'ONLY CHILD' (i.e., a bit "Spoiled"). They love me too much, I must confess. In that sense... I AM SPOILED!

I am a "FRANCISCAN FRIAR" because the Friars of Pulaski, WI were a "Teaching" Order... and their Diocesan High School in Philadelphia was the place of my High School education and my immersion into the distinctive "FRANCISCAN" way of being CHURCH. I attended a local Philadelphia College (LaSalle University, B.S. in Finance/Economics) --- and then attended my Seminary training in Chicago some years later (Catholic Theological Union, M.Div.).

#### School

\* The basketball hoop and rim by the garage have been removed, making gardening easier

\* Still have one booyah kettle that should be removed from the booyah shed

\* Garage needs to be cleaned

\* Discussed having an auction company coming in to see if it's worthwhile to have an auction to sell unused items in the school

\* There's a leak in the porch of the Family Services building

## Church

\* Carpet tiles in front of the confessional area are going to be removed and replaced with a new color of carpet tile, so there are extra carpet tiles for areas in the church that are showing wear or large spaces at the seams

\* The handicap door mechanism will be replaced because it's past its useful stage. This will be done by Tri-State

\* Discussion as to how to fix the gap between the fence and the southeast corner of the church wall to prevent people from going through that opening

\* Concrete is to be put where there are ruts in the grass by the tree in the handicap parking lot

\* Discussion regarding the black streetlights at the outside of the church, possibly replace with remote lighting



# **Education Endowment Advisory Board**

# St. Mary of the Angels invited area churches to this year's event

**GREEN BAY** — Franciscan Fr. Bill Stout called on the words attributed to a 20th-century saint on Sunday, Aug. 18.

At an ecumenical prayer service during the fourth annual St. Mary of the Angels Parish Block Party, Fr. Stout, priest moderator and priest celebrant at the parish, led the reciting of "This is what we are about," a prayer ascribed to St. Oscar Romero, who was assassinated in 1980 while serving as archbishop of San Salvador.

A line in the prayer reads: "It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and to do the rest."

Fr. Stout said that the prayer calls on God's help in restoring "civility and holiness" in the world, but the words can also apply to the purpose of Sunday's event: to bring people together.

"I call it a 'fun-raiser,' not a fundraiser," said Deacon Paul Umentum, pastoral leader at St. Mary of the Angels, about the Block Party. "We don't charge for anything. It's for the neighborhood. It started with the apartments here (the Friar House Flats in the renovated friary building) to get people acclimated to us. We wanted people to know who we are."

"We put flyers on doors in a two-block area," said Deacon Umentum. "We want it to stay local. It's a neighborhood event. We don't buy food with the grant (funds). The parish sponsors that. The grant helped us with the band and other entertainment."

"The grant is based on diversity. This a very diverse area, the surrounding neighborhoods, and we have the apartments," said Leanne Snell, a parish member for about 20 years and chair of the Block Party Committee. "This year, we did a new thing. We invited area churches. It's about bringing various communities, various people together."

Remnant Church, St. Paul Lutheran, United Church of Christ, Grace Lutheran and Congregation Cnesses Israel Temple were all invited.

"It's an ecumenical effort and I love that," said Scott Eastman, lead pastor at Remnant Church. "When Deacon Paul said, 'You're welcome to come,' I said, 'I don't want to just come. What can we do to help?'"

Remnant Church set up a prayer table at the event and a station for making tie-dye shirts. Eastman, who joined the Block Party Committee, said that he would like to see more ecumenical opportunities.

"In our last meeting, I said, 'What can we do to

bring Green Bay with us to heaven? Let's work together towards that," he said.

"We probably should do more of it. We hope to be invited, and the important thing when we get invited is that we show up," said Fr. Stout about ecumenical events.

"I'm going to make sure that I get to know all the (area) church ministers," he added. "When they are doing something and tell me about it, I will try to get a contingent of us to go over there and vice versa."

For St. Mary of the Angels parishioners, the Block Party is an opportunity to work together and for fellowship among the congregation, said Snell.

"We have a great committee of 13 people. This is a multi-person event," she said. "It can get a little stressful putting everything together, but it's fun because everyone is so helpful. It's a good event to get to know each other."

"It's great for me, I get to meet people outside of Mass," said Fr. Stout, who began serving at the parish in July.

Lilian Bock, a parish member for three years and block party volunteer, said she hopes the event helps to grow the St. Mary of the Angels community.

"It's very nice," she said. "Maybe some people here today will like the church and become members."
